WHO WE SUPPORT

BREAKING THE STIGMA OF MENTAL HEALTH



Disseminated the first-ever Bay Area Korean Needs Assessment to policymakers and launched mental health training workshops for community health workers.



Conducted culturally-based mental health workshops and increased culturally-based counseling services to meet the needs of more Korean Americans.



ASIAN HEALTH SERVICES

Developed a new Korean-language curriculum, trained Korean community leaders through mental health workshops, and held the first community-wide film screening and discussion.

EMPOWERING SURVIVORS



Legal Outreach

Expanded legal and social services for Korean survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault and trafficking, nearly tripling Korean clients from the previous year.



Developed new resources in Korean to empower survivors to make critical decisions about seeking services as well as a bilingual community interpreter's guide regarding violence, trauma and social services.

Provided programs and services to nearly 70 seniors each day and transportation to the Center for approximately 25 seniors with limited mobility.



KOREAN AMERICAN

Provided social services for nearly 2,000 low-income families, individuals and seniors, and reached more than 200 through the Alzheimers Forum and Care Support Group.

Served an estimated 200 seniors through weekday lunches, exercise and enrichment classes, social service counseling, etc.

Empowered its seniors to give back by distributing food weekly to home-bound community residents of all races and volunteering weekly to clean Golden Gate Park.

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION



Expanded a successful mentoring model to the Korean American community, to match underserved, vulnerable Korean American children with adults to support positive youth development.

Launched Bay Area Korean Infoline (BAKI), Bay Area's first dedicated Korean and English information line, which received 4,000 calls in only 6 months ranging from social services to immigration questions.

Provided a safe, phone-based crisis support for Koreans who call to share their struggles and challenges with trained volunteers.
